What is Social Emotional Learning?

<u>CASEL</u> defines Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) as the process through which children and adults acquire and effectively apply the knowledge, attitudes, and skills necessary to:

- ★ understand and manage emotions
- ★ set and achieve positive goals
- ★ feel and show empathy for others
- ★ establish and maintain positive relationships
- ★ make responsible decisions

Research shows that it's important for students to see and hear **consistent messages**, both from all the adults they encounter at school and **beyond the school day**.

What is CASEL?

Collaborative for Academic, Social, and Emotional Learning (CASEL) is the framework being used by <u>Belmont Public Schools</u>.

- ★ An evidence-based framework used in schools to promote Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) in grades k-12 through various modalities
- ★ Intention to bolster student skills in communication, cooperation, conflict resolution, resiliency, decision making, compassion, and social responsibility through classroom and home community building exercises
- ★ CASEL's data-driven approach demonstrates a relationship between SEL and an increase in students' abilities to manage themselves and relationships as well as a decrease in behavioral problems.



CASEL Pedagogical Strategy

- ★ Teaching practices that emphasize cooperative learning and project-based learning
- ★ Making sure classroom lessons reflect overall school culture
- ★ Teaching children through modeling, coaching, and reflective listening how to respond compassionately and empathetically

Five Competencies in SEL

- 1. **Self-Awareness**: the ability to recognize your emotions, values, strengths, and limitations
- 2. Self-Management: the ability to manage emotions and behaviors to achieve your goals
- 3. Social Awareness: the ability to show understanding and empathy for others
- 4. **Responsible Decision Making**: the ability to make personal and social choices that are ethical and constructive
- 5. **Relationship Skills**: the ability to form positive relationships, work as part of a team, and effectively deal with conflict

Classroom Practices Based on the Five CASEL Competencies

1. Self-Awareness

Check-ins at the start of class or beginning of the day

- ★ What color are you today?
- ★ What weather pattern are you today?

Powerful SEL Activities:

- ★ <u>Mindfulness</u>: sensory practice to become more present
- ★ Name the emotion: have each student share how they are feeling at the beginning of class



2. Self-Management

<u>Strategies for Self-Awareness and Self-Management</u>: Use this tool to search for activities based on students' age and the amount of time you have available to find activities

- ★ Dual Drawings
- ★ Dual Story Writing
- ★ Brain Scavenger Hunt

<u>Guided Meditation</u>: This can be facilitated in person or over Zoom by reading a guided meditation or playing a meditation video you like from YouTube. Add mindfulness to the conversation, and <u>learn more here</u>.

Powerful SEL Activities: Growth mindset vs. fixed mindset share-out: students share moments when they have demonstrated each

3. Social Awareness

Powerful SEL Activities:

- ★ Quote of the day: introduce a quote relevant to what students are learning and break them into pairs to discuss together
- ★ Where we came from: have students share a picture of themselves as a baby as well as a story from their childhood
- ★ Starting positive: have students share the positive qualities of their classmates
- ★ Motivational moment: have each student present on a topic they are passionate about, allowing classmates to learn more about each other's interests and perspectives
- ★ Circle sharing: have small groups work together to share their perspectives to allow students to build and practice empathy
- ★ Write a poem from someone else's perspective
- ★ Have a conversation with someone you don't know
- ★ Play interest and identity-related bingo



4. Responsible Decision Making

<u>Give Students Choices</u>: Allow students to choose how they complete a project (e.g., paper, presentation, video, website) to allow them to practice making their own decisions based on what is best for them

Class Activities for Responsible Decision Making:

- 1. Make a class contract
- 2. Elect a student council
- 3. "What would you do?" activity

Teach Problem-Solving:

- 1. Identify the problem
- 2. Analyze the situation
- 3. Solve the problem
- 4. Consider ethical responsibility
- 5. Evaluate and reflect

5.Relationship Skills

<u>Appreciate, Apology, Aha Closing Activity</u>: Have students share something they appreciated, an apology, or an aha moment from the lesson as a closing activity to build community
